

# Racial Equity and Inclusion Program Report

The purpose of this report is to provide data to help your program assess racial equity and inclusion at three points:

## 1. Referral

Court Cases vs. Program Referral Comparison (from CCAP and CORE)  
Court Conviction Data: Drug and OWI Cases (from CCAP data) - each case counted once (per drug/OWI)  
Court Conviction Data: Drug and OWI Charges (from CCAP data) - all drug/OWI charges displayed (except trafficking)  
Court Conviction Data: Other Charges (from CCAP data) - all charges displayed  
Program Referral Details (from CORE)

*Note: the cases/charges displayed from CCAP data all involve convictions due to trials or pleas and for which a sentence exists. Defendants involved in the CCAP cases that are displayed may or may not have been eligible for a program; other people convicted of other crimes that were not drug/OWI charges may also have been eligible for a treatment court program but are not included. The determination of whether a case involved a conviction for a "violent" charge was based on the statutes listed as "violent" under 941.291(1)(b) or 165.84(7)(ab). These could include offenses that are NOT "violent" under the TAD statute.*

*Note: Many referred individuals are classified as "Ineligible" with "Other" selected as the only reason for their ineligibility, yet the reason entered in as a comment does not explain why the person is not eligible; in many cases it is actually not known if the person was eligible or not (they were never assessed, they were out of contact for months, etc.). For this reason, a list of participants who are listed in CORE as "Ineligible" and reason "Other" is the only reason selected is provided for programs to review and consider whether the person is truly "Ineligible". A person can be ineligible for a number of reasons; all of them are shown on the bar graph. Because of this, numbers on the bar graph of reasons may exceed the number of ineligible participants.*

## 3. Graduation

Current Status of Participants Admitted after being Referred 2018-2019

*Note: The current status is based on participants who were admitted from the 2018-2019 referral cohort (everyone referred in 2018-2019), not the discharge cohort; this may not include everyone admitted in 2018-2019 or everyone discharged in 2018-2019. Many participants may still be active in the program without a discharge type yet. If any participants appear as "Pending Discharge," these individuals have been discharged in CORE but their overall status has not been closed out in CORE; program staff should review these participants in CORE and complete the missing data.*

Data Notes: Details about referred individuals who are listed as "Ineligible" with "Other" as the only reason selected are shown on the last page for review; details about individuals who are listed under "Pending Discharge" are also included for review. Data shown in this report is based on data entered into court databases and into CORE by CORE users, and is only as complete and accurate as what was available at the time it was pulled for this report. The year used for court data was the year of sentencing (2018-2019) and the year used for CORE data was the referral year (2018-2019). All participants entered in CORE are included in the report, including individuals who may not be TAD-funded. 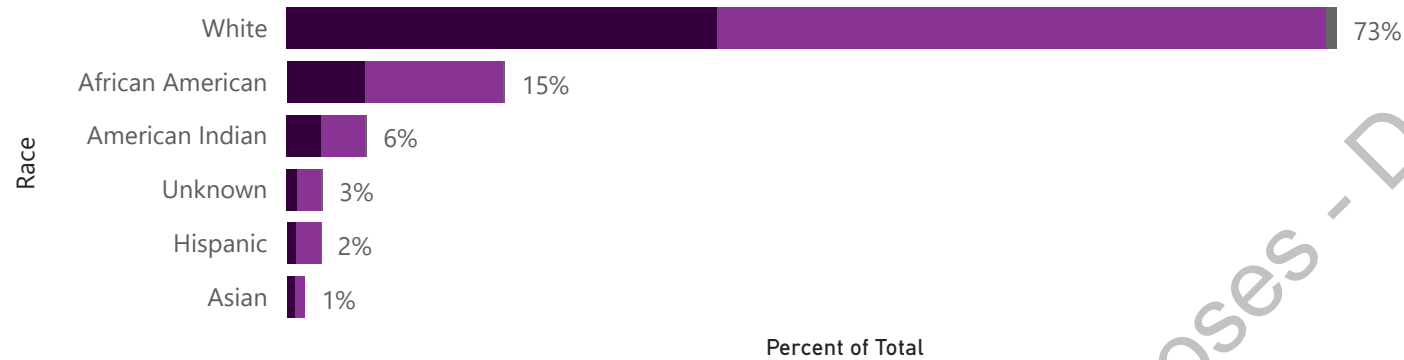

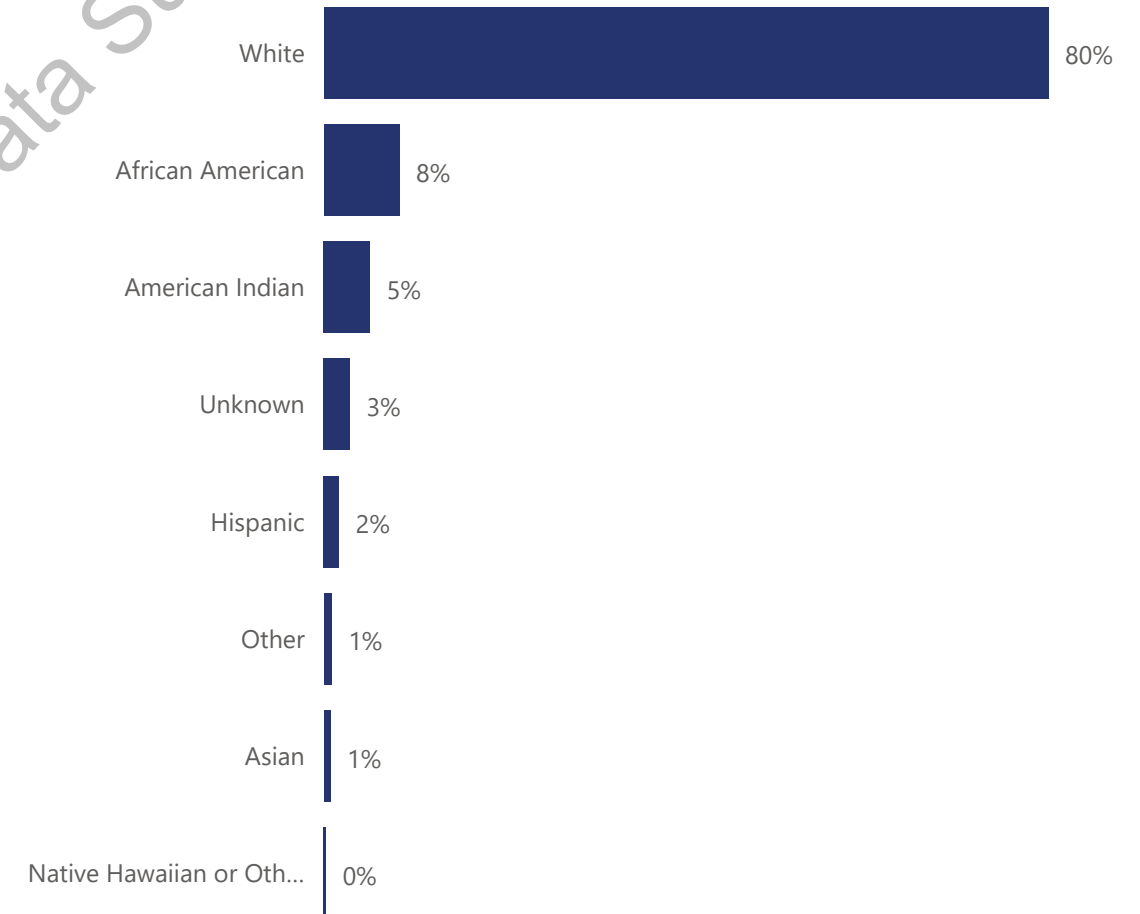


### OWI Case Convictions by Race and Severity

# Part 1: Court Conviction Data: Drug and OWI Cases

The first part of this report includes adult criminal circuit court data with convictions, in which the sentencing date was in 2018 or 2019. Cases with drug (but not drug trafficking) and/or OWI convictions were accessed from court data; each case was counted once under the most severe class (felony or misdemeanor) separately for drug and OWI. Cases were then flagged if there was ALSO a conviction for a "violent" charge on the same case. The defendant's residency was determined based on the zip code listed as their primary address with the court record. All cases regardless of resident (of the county) status or violent involvement are shown on this page.

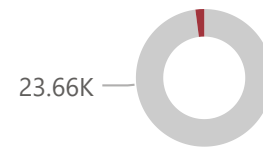

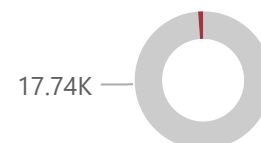

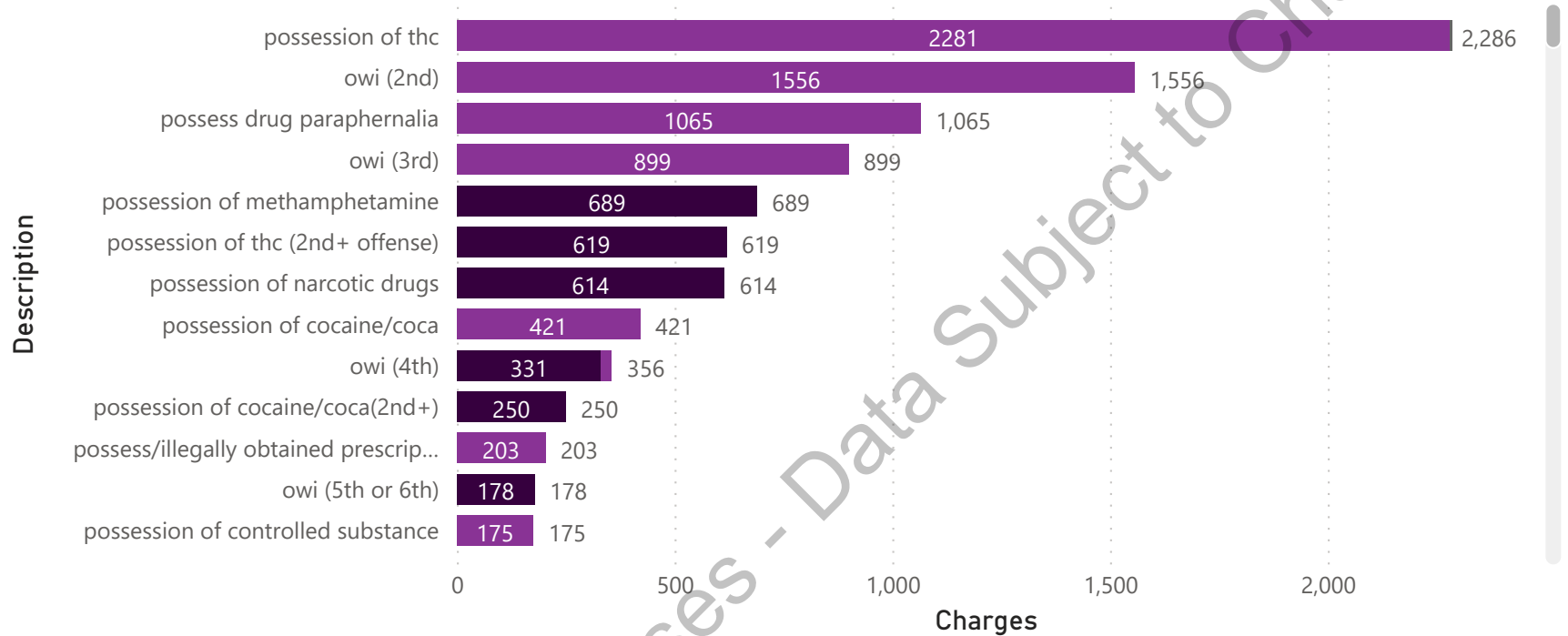

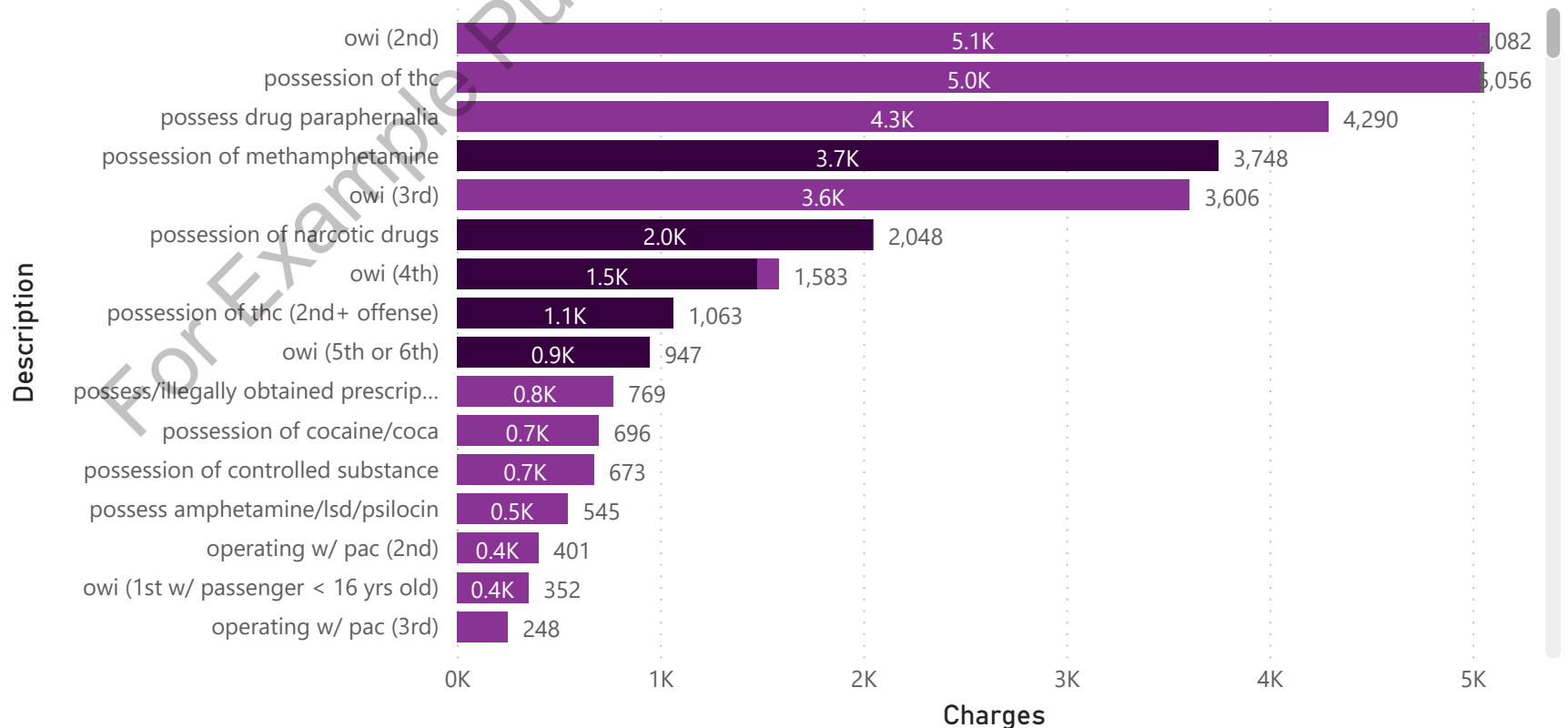

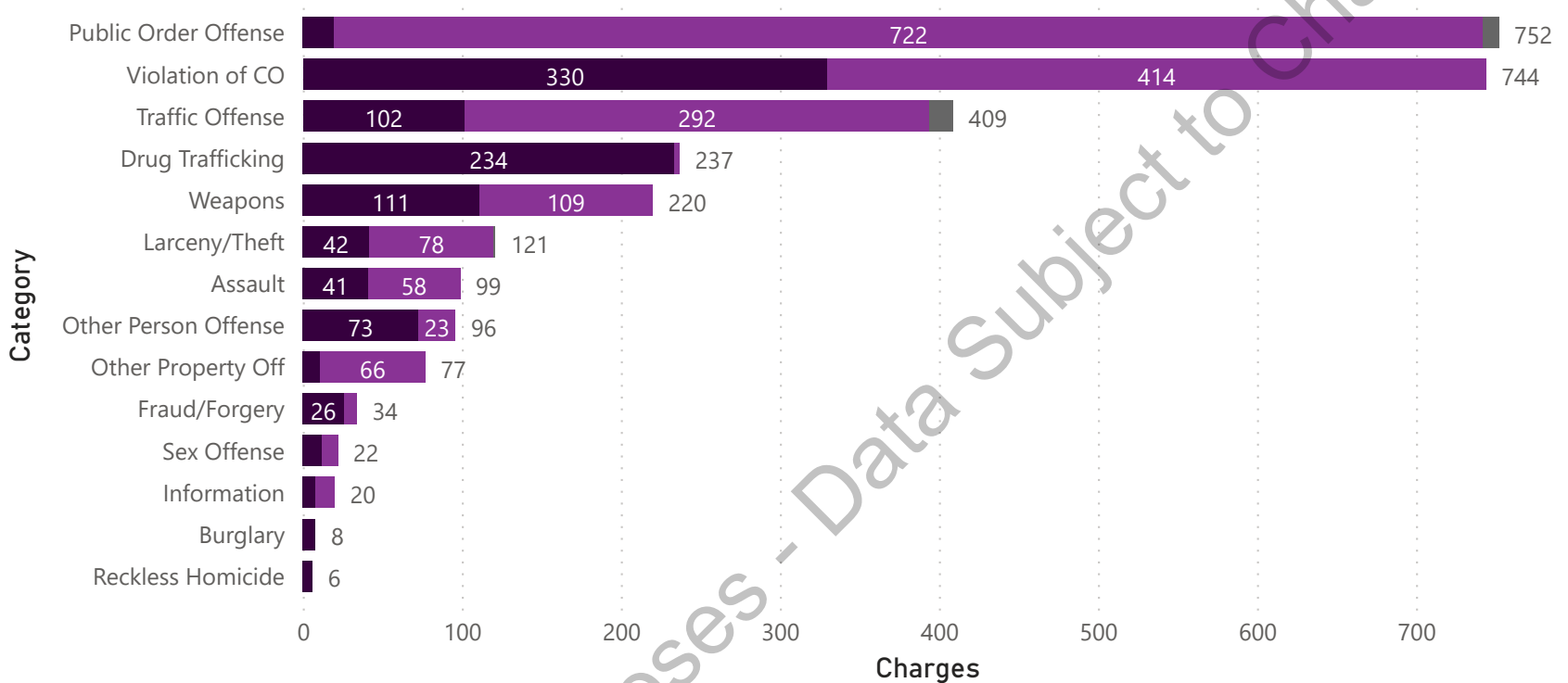

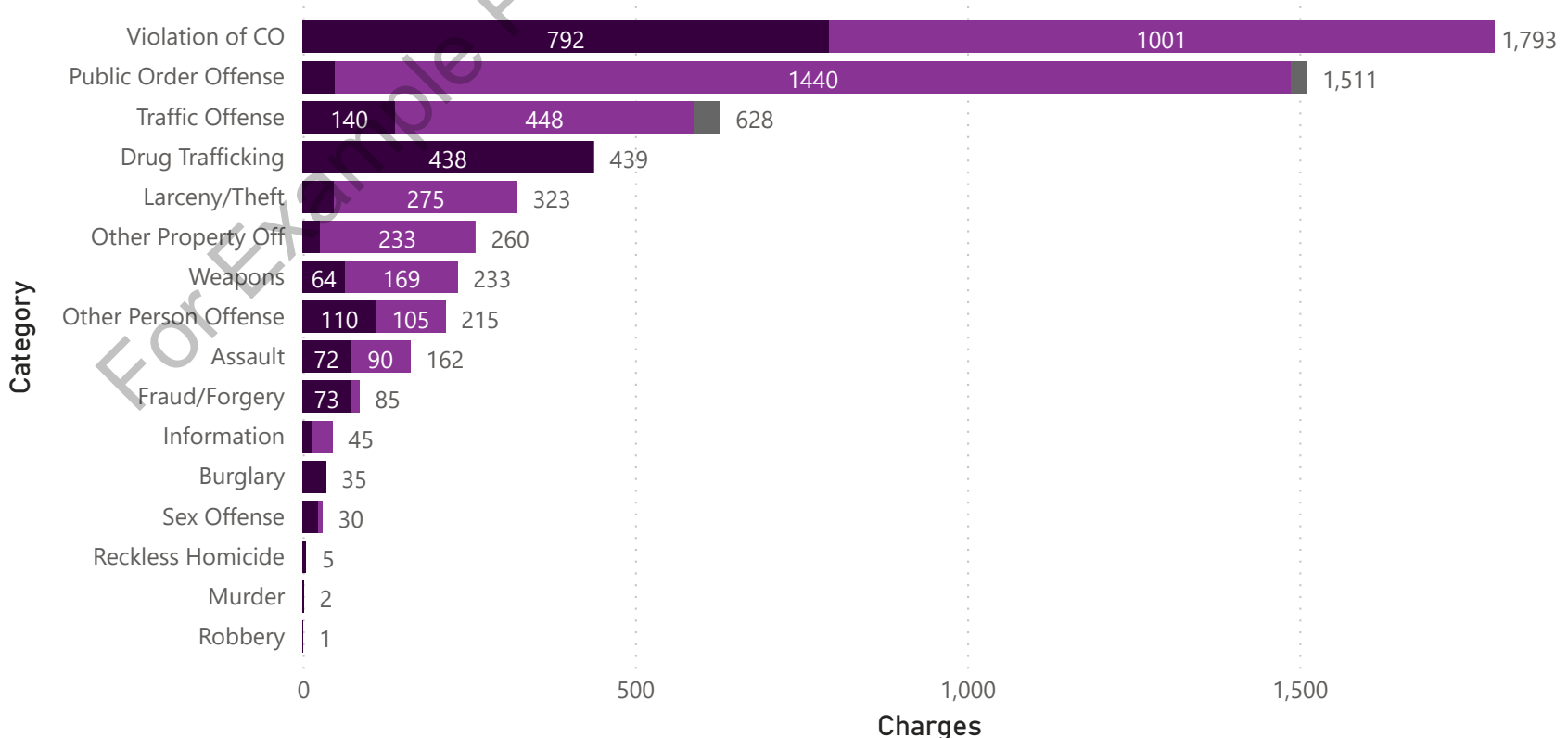

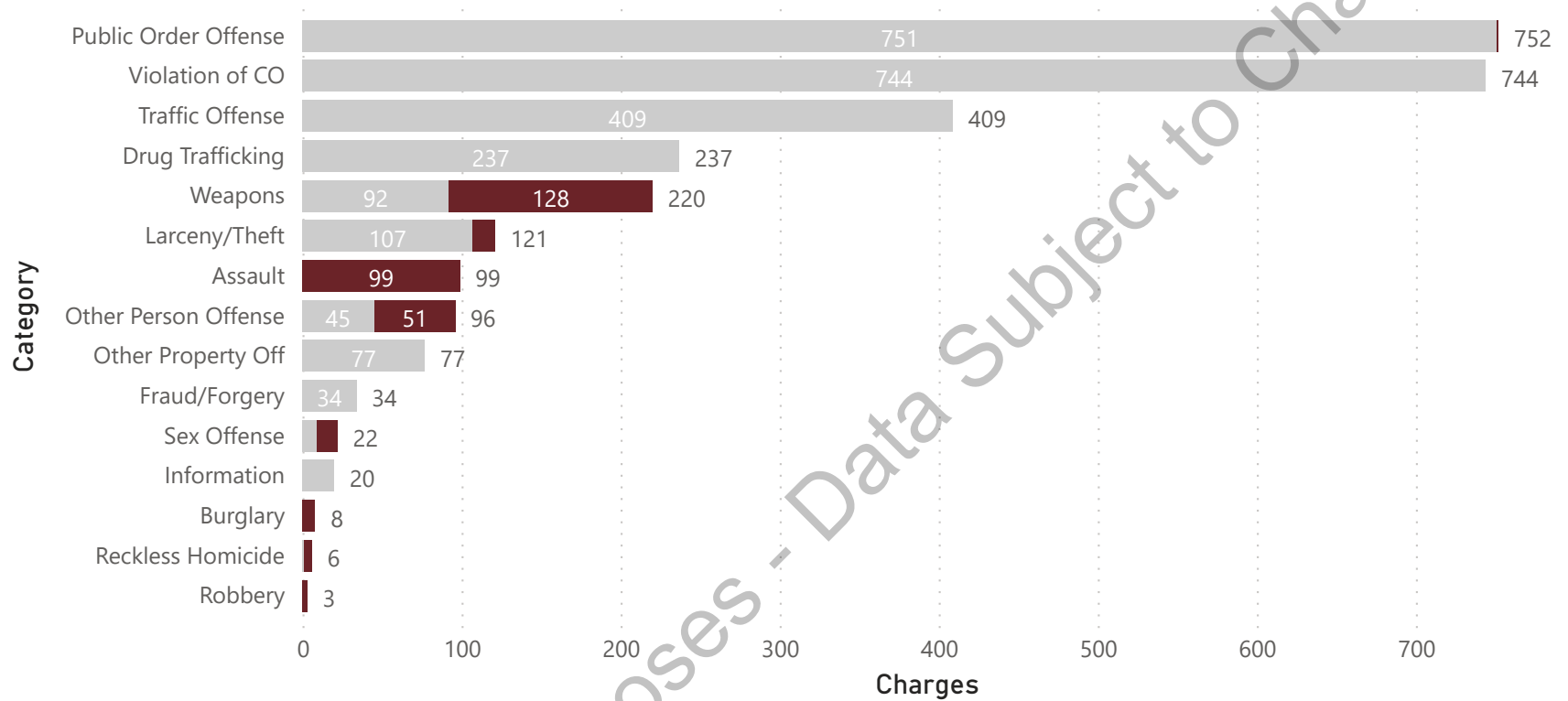

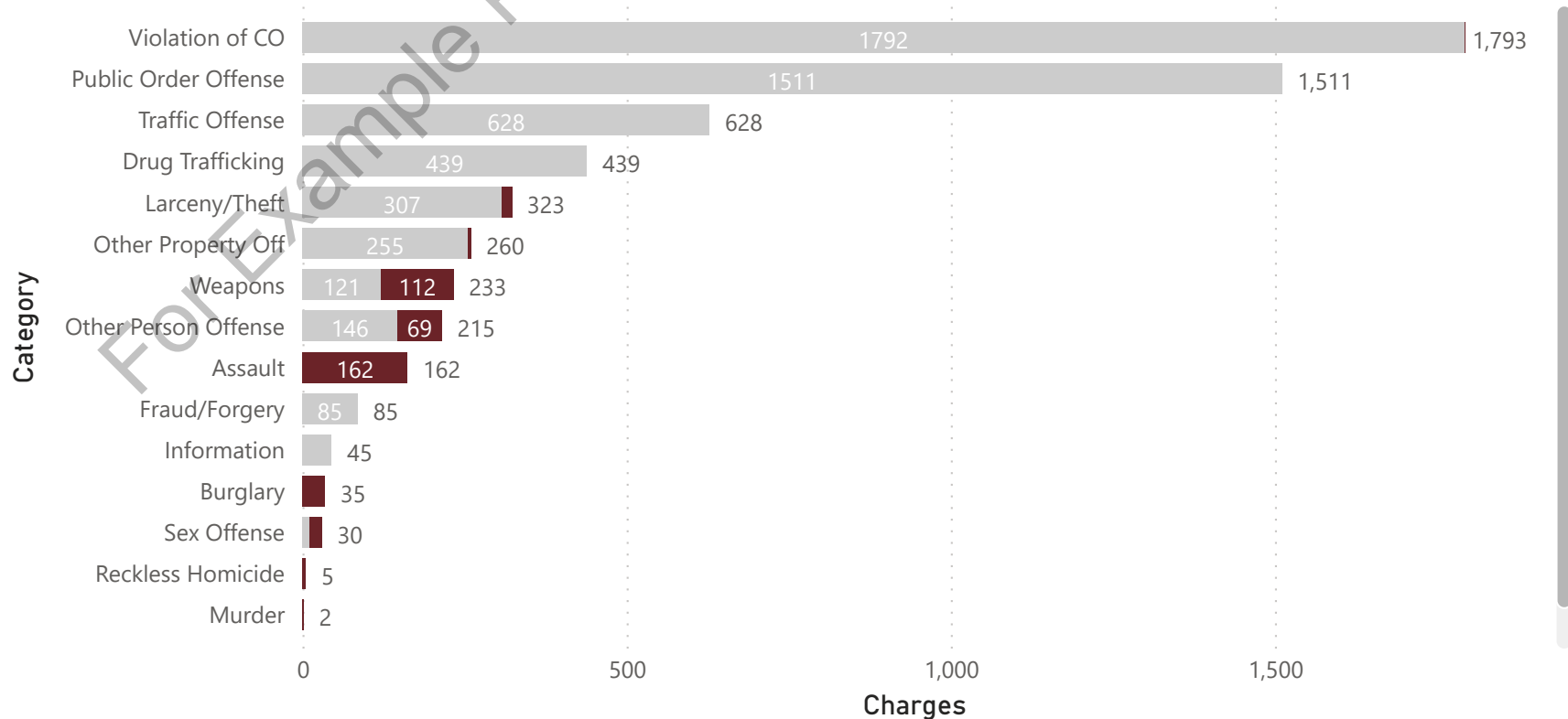

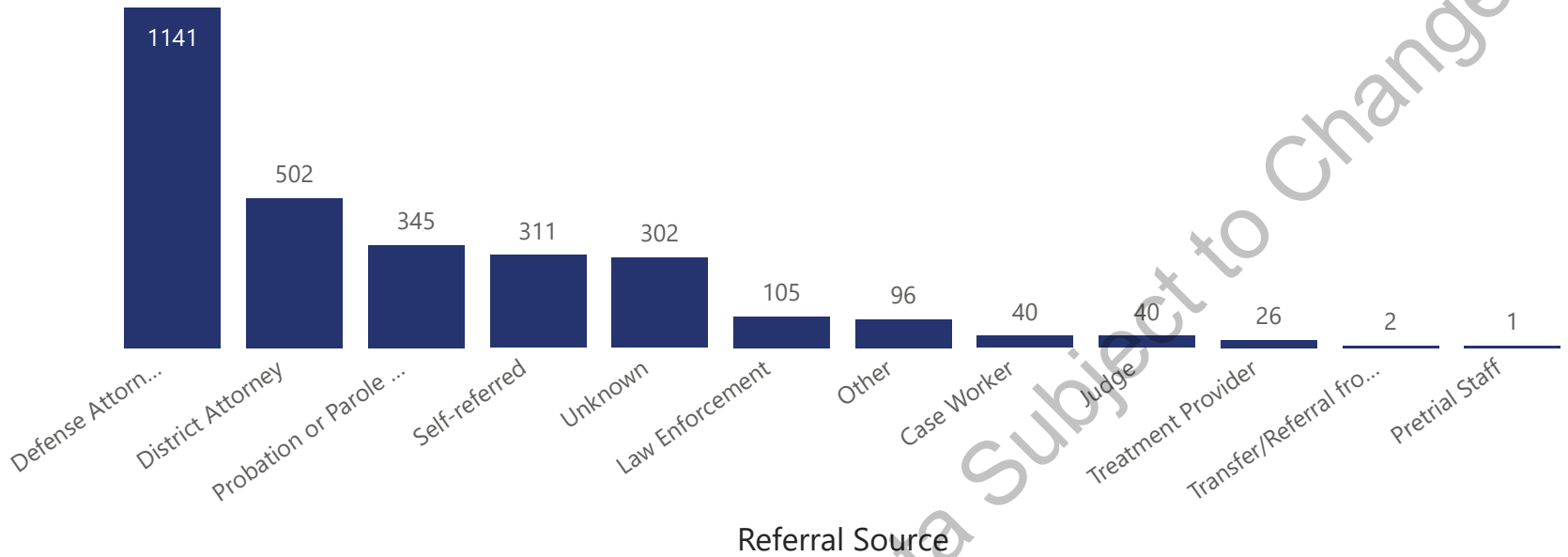

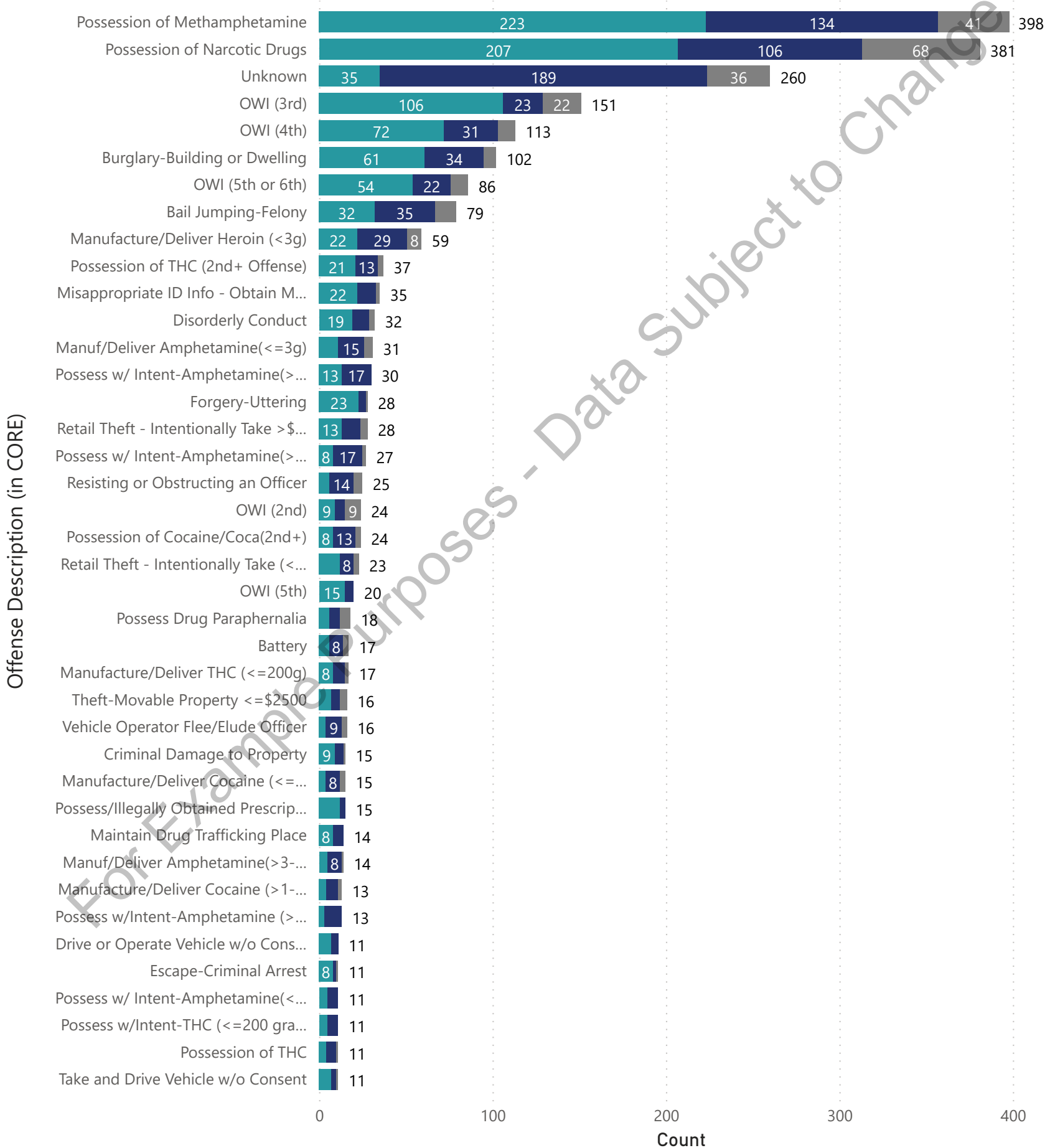

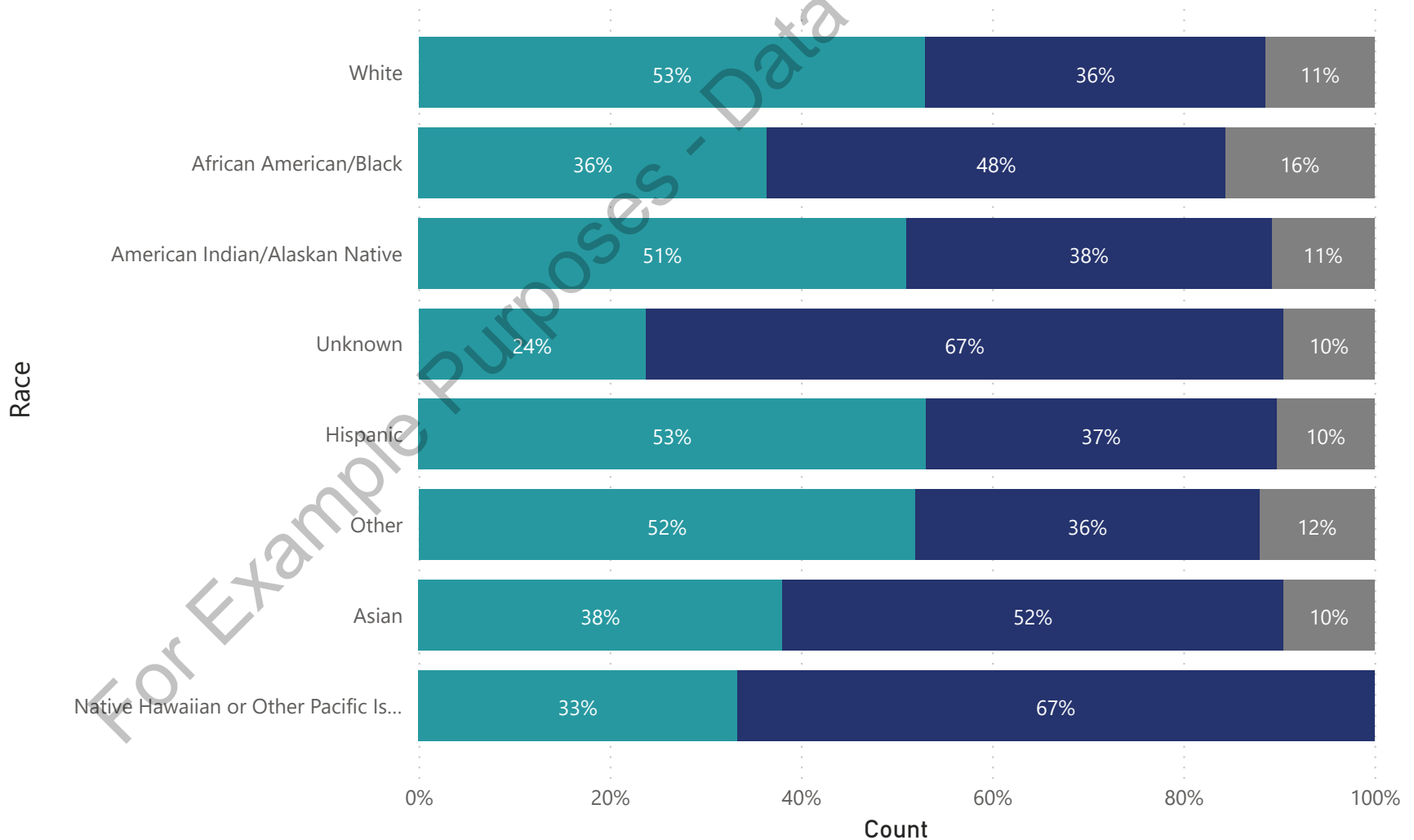

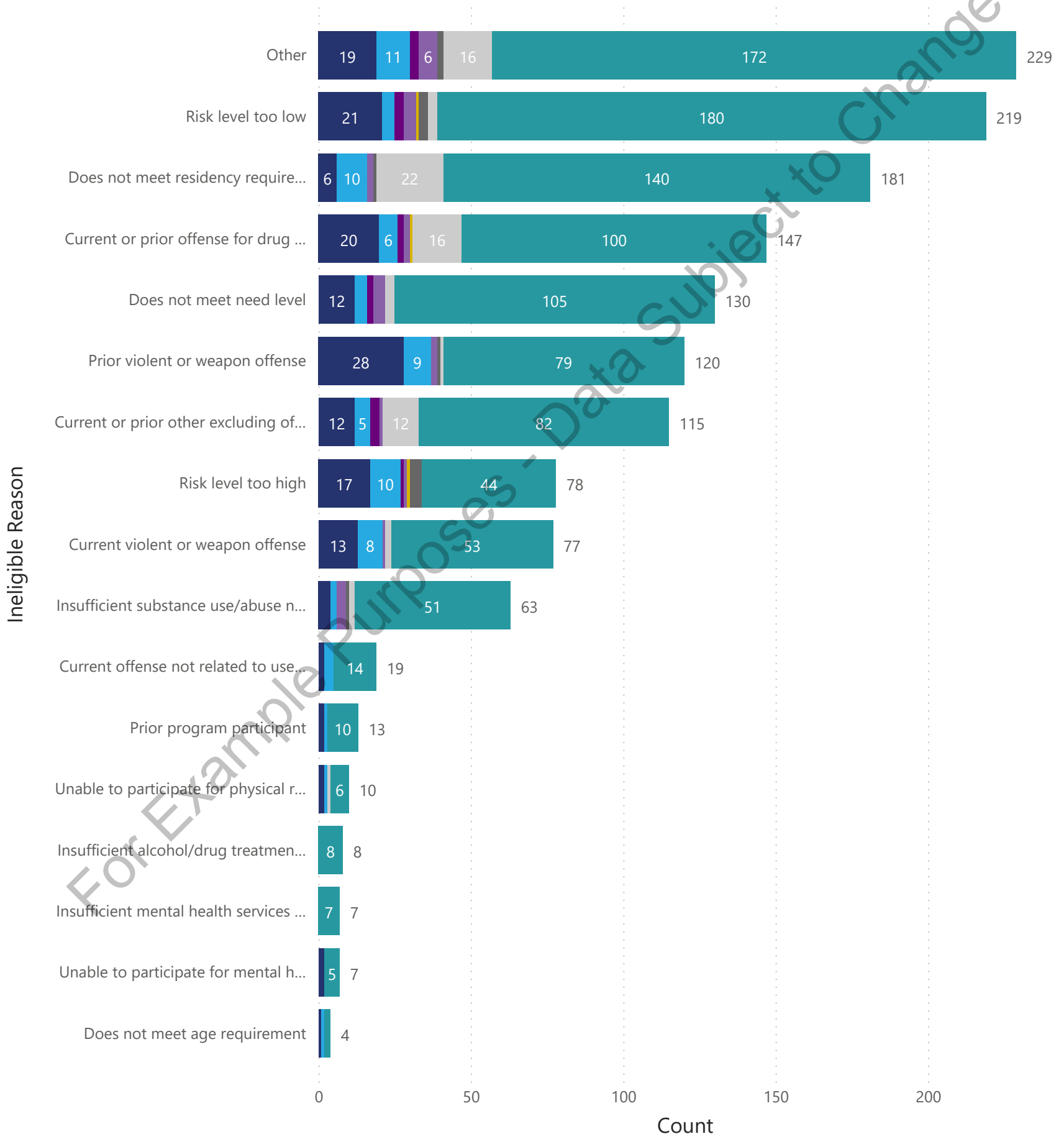

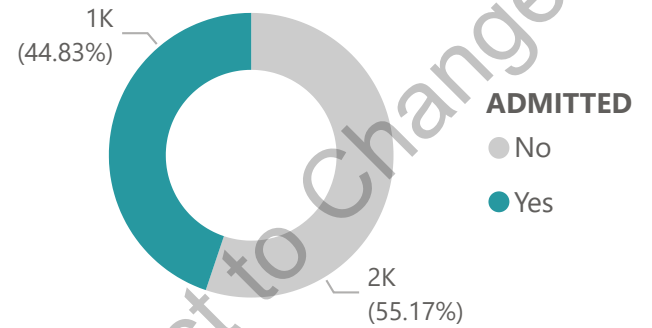

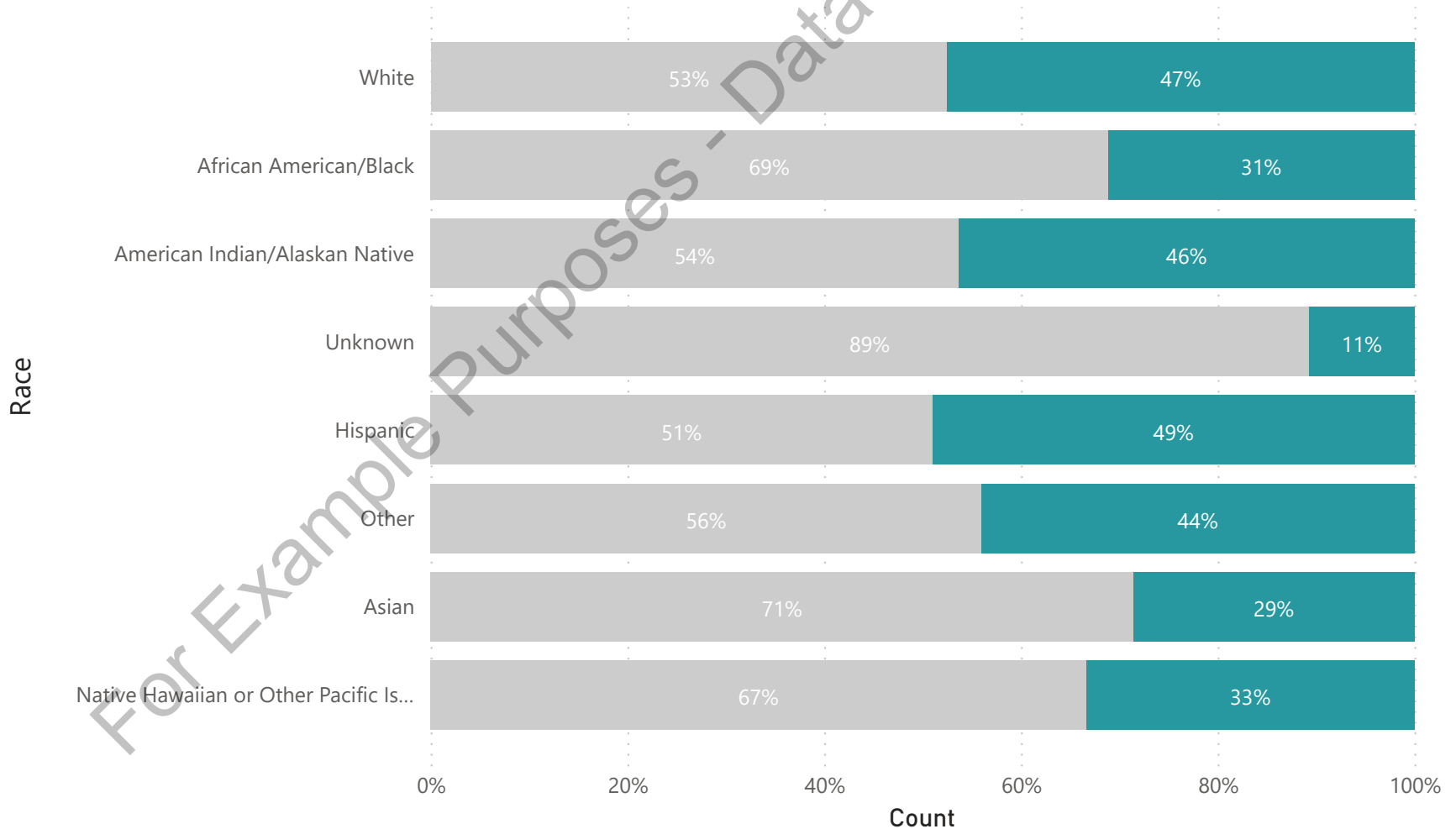

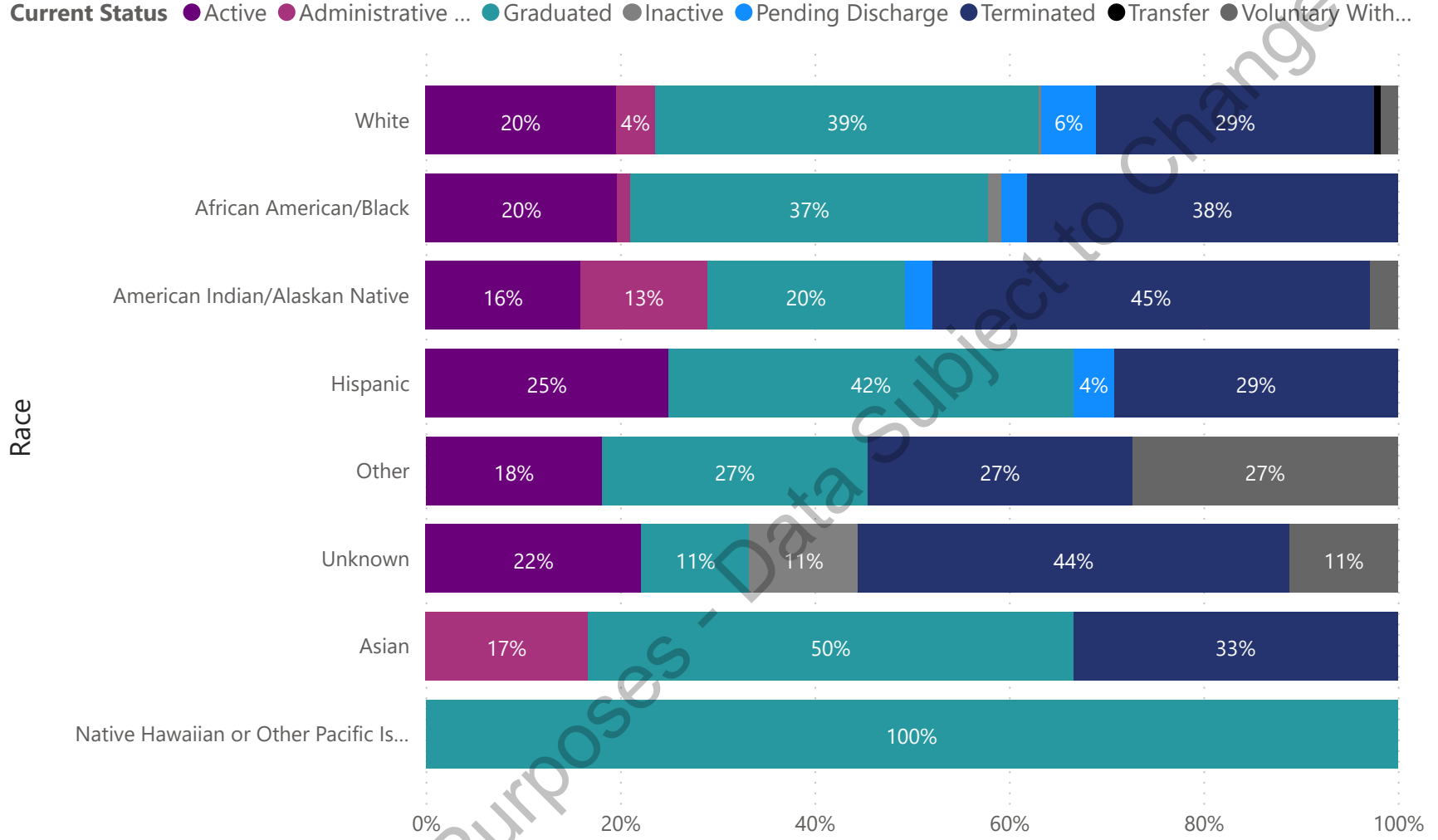
